

FY 2003 Bureau of Justice Assistance Earmarks

As in previous fiscal years, the Bureau of Justice Assistance (BJA) has been directed to administer numerous earmarks from several funding sources. Most of the FY 2003 earmarks are funded under the Byrne Discretionary grant program, but other FY 2003 earmarks are found within the Terrorism Prevention and Response Training program, Local Law Enforcement Block Grant program (LLEBG), and the Indian Correctional Facilities Construction program. Also, through negotiated agreements with other bureaus and offices within the Office of Justice Programs (OJP) and COPS, BJA has agreed to administer some earmarks where (1) we already have an established relationship with the recipient agencies or (2) the earmarks fit well with our ongoing initiatives. These program funding sources include the Crime Identification Technology Act (CITA), Juvenile Justice Programs (JJ Part C or JJ Tribal Youth), COPS Methamphetamine/ Hot Spots, COPS Law Enforcement Technology, and the NIJ Law Enforcement Technology program.

BJA's FY 2003 earmarks are listed below by state where the grant recipient is located. The site-based earmarks are overseen by BJA's Programs Office. BJA's Policy Office administers earmarks listed under National Programs; these earmarks are not site-specific, but rather support efforts on the national level and provide national leadership in criminal justice policy, training, and technical assistance to further the administration of justice.

A rescission in the amount of 0.65% has been applied to the FY 2003 Department of Justice Appropriation, and the amount of funding available for all earmarks was reduced proportionally—column labeled Amount. For example, earmarks appropriated at \$1 million will actually receive no more than \$993,500 ($\$1 \text{ million} - 0.65\% = \$993,500$).
