BJS RELEASES REPORTS ON MORTALITY IN PRISONS AND JAILS

WASHINGTON — The Department of Justice's Bureau of Justice Statistics today released *Mortality in State and Federal Prisons*, 2001-2016 – Statistical Tables, which provides statistics on deaths among persons in the custody of state and federal prisons; and *Mortality in Local Jails*, 2000-2016 – Statistical Tables, which provides statistics on inmates who died in the custody of local jails nationwide.
